Details for delegates arriving in Durham.


The Roman Army School 2020 is being held at St. Chads College. The college is located directly opposite the cathedral's rose window in the North Bailey. In the photo below it is the door with the light above and metal plaque to the side. The reception is located here for check in and all lectures and meals will be held in this building.

The accommodation is also in St. Chads college, but may be located in a building a little further down the street – We are usually in 'Lightfoot' located between three or four doors along to the right of the green reception door in the photo below – the reception will be able to advise delegates of their rooms location when they check in.

It is possible to park vehicles outside the college doors for a **short time** (see white lined area in above photo) whilst checking in, however the road is narrow and parking may last no longer than half an hour, the official car park for the event is at Trinity Hall – see attached map for details. from the South & East

Drive north on the A1 (M) and exit at Junction 62. Take the A690 to Durham. After three miles, at the first roundabout take the second main exit which crosses under a pedestrian footbridge. You will see immediately in front of you a magnificent view of the cathedral, Castle, and city.

At the next roundabout take the second exit left and travel up the slip road. At the top, turn left into the Market Place (road is signposted Access Only). Travel forward at the traffic lights into Saddler Street. The road is narrow and uphill. Follow this road which will lead you into North Bailey and St Chad's College on the left. from the North & East

Drive south on the A1(M) and exit at Junction 62. Take the A690 to Durham. After three miles, at the first roundabout take the second main exit which crosses under a pedestrian footbridge. You will see immediately in front of you a magnificent view of the cathedral, Castle, and city.

At the next roundabout take the second exit left and travel up the slip road. At the top, turn left into the Market Place (road is signposted Access Only). Travel forward at the traffic lights into Saddler Street. The road is narrow and uphill. Follow this road which will lead you into North Bailey and St Chad's College on the left.

from the West

Drive on the A167 to the Cock of the North roundabout (junction with the A177). Take the Durham A177 exit into South Road until you reach Durham. Travel straight on through the next five sets of traffic lights until you reach the roundabout. Take the first exit left up the slip road. At the top, turn left into the Market Place (road is signposted Access Only). Travel forward at the traffic lights into Saddler Street. The road is narrow and uphill. Follow this road which will lead you into North Bailey and St Chad's College on the left.

On Arrival

Members of the Roman Army School Organisation team will be on site from 2pm to assist delegates with questions and aid in locating rooms and the car park. We will be checking IT

between 2 and 3 but we should be fairly visible, however, if we are unavailable the college staff on reception should be able to assist or at least point you in our direction.

By Train

For delegates arriving by train there is a shuttle bus from the railway station to the Cathedral, Bus number 40. Tickets cost £1 and last all day.

The bus runs Monday to Saturday at 10, 30 and 50 minutes past each hour between 9.50am and 5.10pm. There is also a service at 8.30am Monday to Friday and additional Saturday journeys at 9.10am and 9.30am – see attached document for bus timetable.
